By the end of this unit, I will be able to:

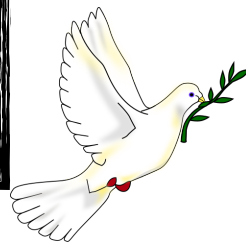
- Understand that Jesus was a friend to all and that he chose 12 disciples to help him spread the Gospel (good news)

Make sense of belief:

- Tell stories from the Bible and recognise a link with the concept of 'Gospel' or 'good news'
- Give clear, simple accounts of what Bible texts (such as the story of Matthew the tax collector) mean to Christians
- Recognise that Jesus gives instructions to people about how to behave

Understand the impact:

- Give at least two examples of ways in which Christians follow the teachings studied about forgiveness and peace, and bringing good news to the friendless
- Give at least two examples of how Christians put these beliefs into practice in the Church community and their own lives (for example: charity, confession)

Make connections:

- Think, talk and ask questions about whether Jesus' 'good news' is only good news for Christians, or if there are things for anyone to learn about how to live, giving a good reason for their ideas.

WALT:

What does the story of Mathew tell us about Jesus?

Share the story of Matthew and how meeting Jesus - "**friend of the friendless**" - changed his life as he became one of Jesus' **disciples**.

Make a poster to show how Christians live like a friend of Jesus (example on server)

Note that Christians believe that they receive these things especially through Jesus - come up with some examples that might apply to children in their own lives.</p>	<p>Create a "Good news" newspaper front page with the headlines friendship, peace and forgiveness. Pupils to write a sentence to demonstrate each of these.</p>	<p>Understand that friendship, peace and forgiveness can be good news for all people</p>
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
