Vocabulary	
Creation	That God created the world and all its inhabitants.
Hymns/Prayer	Songs and a way for Christians to communicate with God.
Old/New Testament	The two parts of the Holy Bible, a book that Christians use to guide them.
Caretaker	Humans looking after one another and all living creatures to show their faith to God.
Fall	Adam and Eve giving in to temptation, and were banished from The Garden of Eden.

- Will explore how humans look after the world, and how Christians look after it.
- Explore hymns and songs to show God as the creator and protector.
- Will explore the story of Noah and the flood.
- Will understand the differences between the Old and New Testament.

Information that will help me

- Christians refer to the singular God or his son, Jesus Christ.
- There are variations on the Creation story and Noah's Ark, the ones we will be looking at are largely believed to be the most accurate.
- Christians believe we are Shepards/caretakers of the world as a way to honour God, who gave us life.
- Christians believe we are children of Adam and Eve, and should be striving to follow the commandments of God.
- Hymns and prayers are way for Christians to communicate to God.
