The Gospels

When people talk about "the gospel," there's only one thing they mean: the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John are the four books of the Bible that record almost everything we know about Jesus. If we want to learn about the things Jesus said and did, we have to turn to these ancient texts, believed to have been written by eyewitnesses or people who spoke with them during the first century. They are stories told in such a way as to evoke a certain image of Jesus for a particular audience.

The Ten commandments

The ten commandments are a set of rules. God wrote the 10 Commandments on stone tablets and gave them Moses to share with all the Israelites soon after they left captivity in Egypt. Moses reiterated them 40 years later in as the Israelites neared the Promised Land. Though God wrote the 10 Commandments thousands of years ago, they still influence our society today.
