

KS1 Geography Knowledge Organiser: Our Cornwall (Map work & fieldwork in our locality)

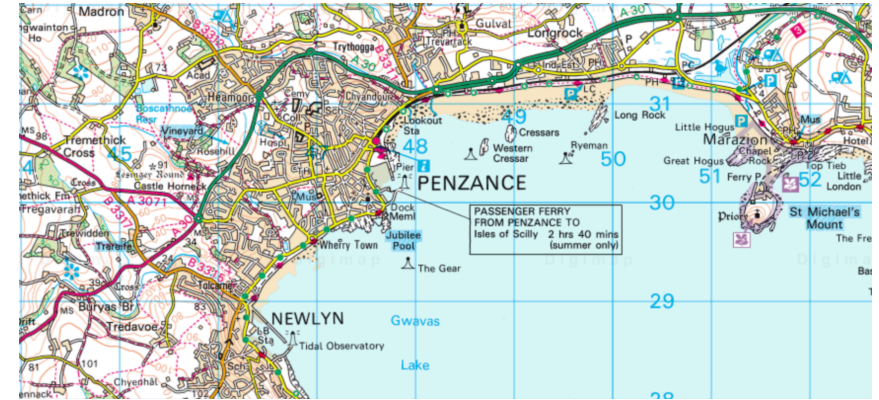
Core knowledge - By the end of this unit, I will be able to:

Key Vocabulary

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Bay	An inlet of the sea where the land curves inwards.	Route	A way between two places.
Celtic Sea	An area of the Atlantic Ocean between Cornwall & Ireland.	Rural	Relating to the countryside rather than to towns.
English Channel	An area of the Atlantic Ocean between England and France.	Town	A settlement bigger than a village but smaller than a city.
Harbour	A place on the coast where ships can moor in shelter.	Urban	Areas where many people live and work closely together - usually towns or cities.
Map	A diagram of an area showing its features.	Village	A small settlement usually in the countryside.
