Key Vocabulary & Concepts			
Asia	The Earth's largest and most populated continent.	Population	The inhabitants of a place.
Human features	Things in the world that have been built by humans.	Culture	A way of life of shared by a group of people.
Physical features	Any thing that occurs naturally (is made by nature).	Traditional	A way of doing things handed down from generation to generation.
Capital City	The city where a country's government is.	Map	A birds-eye drawing of a place.
Weather	The conditions (of the atmosphere) outside now.	Agriculture	Another word for farming (of crops or animals).
Climate	The average weather conditions in a place over time.	Map symbol	A picture that represents a real feature on a map.
