

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The Great Fire of London – timeline September 1666

17th Century	The hundred year period from 1601 to 1700.	Plague	A contagious disease that killed many people.
Diary	A book in which people write down what happens in their life.	Mayor	The leader or governor of a town or city.
Evidence	Clues used to prove that something happened.	Cathedral	A very large church in a city.
Monarch	The ruler of a country: A King, Queen or Emperor.	Warehouse	Large buildings used to store goods.
Parliament	The groups of people who make the laws in our country.	Thatch	Straw used to cover roofs which easily catches alight.
