The 'Big idea' about God	

Christians believe in God as the creator and sustainer of the world who is revealed to people through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the son of God and is at work in the world through the Holy Spirit. God is understood as **Trinity**: **Three in one**; Father, Son and Holy Spirit in perfect relationship with each other.

Information that will help me

- · Jesus was Jewish and Christians believe that Jesus is God in the flesh.
- They believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.
- The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one' a messiah. Some texts talk about what this 'messiah' would be like.
- Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled these expectations, and that he is the Messiah. (Jewish people do not think Jesus is the Messiah).
- · Christians see Jesus as their Saviour.

The Bible Big story is the story of God's relationship with his people. The Bible is made up of many different books written in different styles for different audiences but it all tells the one big story of God's rescue plan for his people. Christians believe that the Bible is the way that God speaks to them through the story of his love for them.
