Where do all the years go?

I started my teaching career in the North East in 1984 ... most of you reading this probably weren't even born! In 1984, Margaret Thatcher was Prime Minister, the Miners' Strike was the major event of the year along with Torvill and Dean winning a gold medal at the Winter Olympics skating to Ravel's Bolero and Bob Geldof masterminded the hit single 'Do they know it's Christmas' with Band Aid. Colin Baker was Dr Who, Everton won the FA Cup Final and Liverpool won the European Cup beating AS Roma on penalties after a 1-1 draw - Grobbelaar performing brilliantly with his 'jelly legs' in the penalty shoot out!

Teaching was very different in 1984 ... my curriculum consisted of three topics per year -Trees, Romans and Houses. I could teach whatever I liked along these themes! Along with a bit of Maths and spelling, that was about it. We did of course teach PE with all the children in their vests and knickers and 'daps' as plimsolls were called in the North East. I ran a rounders club in my very first year of teaching. The education must have been ok though as some very successful children slipped through my fingers. Then, as now, we all worked really hard to give the children the best start in life we could. We made sure we really knew each child, learnt how to get the best out of each and every one of them, valued them as individuals and made sure they were happy and enjoyed coming to school.

I started coming to Alverton as a parent in 1997 when my eldest son was three and have been coming pretty much every day since. I started doing a bit of supply when Mr Lees was the Headteacher and never left. I am very proud to have been part of Alverton School. It is a fantastic community of staff, children and parents and, as I always tell people, if my boys were three and five again, I would still choose Alverton. Whilst I am mentioning Alverton as a choice of school, I have to say it is really a very special place. Relationships, kindness, support and community are at the centre of everything Alverton does and I know how proud the children are to wear their lovely red uniform with the bright lighthouse shining.

I do not have enough words to express how special the children that I have taught have been. They bring joy, laughter, awe and wonder to every classroom. I am always amazed when I go to local events, supermarkets, restaurants and pubs and see past students who have said I have made a difference to their lives. The staff at Alverton are amazing and I feel very privileged to have worked with so many talented, supportive and lovely people. I will miss them more than they all realise.

I feel very honoured to have been a part of Alverton School and whilst I am ready to retire from teaching after thirty-nine years, my life is so much richer for having taught at this amazing place. Even though it will be incredibly difficult to leave, I wouldn't have missed a moment.

Free School Meals / Pupil Premium

Registering a child as eligible for free school meals (as described below) means that your child receives a free meal every day (though they can, of course, bring a packed lunch should they prefer) but there are additional benefits too. Pupil Premium brings more money into the school to help children achieve and learn. Children in receipt of the Pupil Premium also receive other benefits (eg contributions towards Key Stage 2 camps and funding to use for uniform, music lessons, trips etc). At some times, there are further benefits for these children such as food vouchers during holiday times where these are given. Please see the Pupil Premium Provision Map in the Pupil Premium section of our website http://www.alverton.org.uk/website/pupil premium/172518 or speak to Mrs Gill or Mrs Stacey in the office or contact Mrs O'Rourke who leads our Pupil Premium provision.

The easiest and quickest way to apply for free school meals is online through the Cornwall Council website but, if you are unable to do this, you can call the Free School Meals team on 01872 323298 and a member of the team will call you back to complete the application over the phone.

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent / carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

· Income Support (IS)

· Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

 \cdot Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

· Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

 \cdot Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

· Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

· Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Support

 \cdot Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are NOT eligible for free school meals, regardless of what other benefits / credits are being claimed:

· Working Tax Credit

 \cdot Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and / or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance

NB All Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils are entitled to receive a free school meal as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative, regardless of what benefits are being claimed. However, some children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 may also have an entitlement to benefits-related free school meals and it is important to apply for these if you think your child may be eligible.

Registering for free school meals / Pupil Premium is confidential. If you think that your child is eligible, we strongly recommend that you contact Cornwall Council as detailed above. Mrs Gill and Mrs Stacey in the office will also be able to help you and answer any questions you may have.
