Vocabulary	
Faith	another word for trust - Christians believe that even when bad things happen, they can trust God and be at peace because He is with them and in control
Prayer	a form of communication with God - Christians believe this deepens their relationship with God
Covenant	a sacred agreement or mutual promise between God and a person or a group of people.
Baptism	a ceremony to welcome a new member to the church, where promises are made
Wedding	when two people commit their lives to one another, making promises to each other and God
Compare	to bring together for the purpose of discovering similarities and differences
New Testament	second part of the Bible, written years after Jesus lived
Old Testament	the first part of the Bible, written before Jesus was born
Promise	statement that something absolutely will happen or be done
Trinity	the belief that God is three in one: God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit
Ceremony	formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event
Symbol	a thing that represents or stands for something else
