What we already know:

England is a country of the United Kingdom in the British Isles.

Prior to the Roman Invasion is a period known as Pre-History as there are no written records of the time.

The three periods of Pre-History are the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. The period immediately prior to the Romans, the Iron Age, saw a group of people called the Celts inhabiting Britain. They lived in separate tribes, in roundhouses, often in hillforts. The discovery of how to make iron allowed them to make stronger and harder weapons and tools which advanced their society.

Super Six

The Romans invaded unsuccessfully in BCE55 and BCE54 with Julius Caesar before the successful invasion by Claudius in CE43.

The Romans invaded for several reasons. They wanted the natural resources such as tin, lead, silver and gold as well as the timber, cattle and sheep. They also wanted to take slaves and win greater glory for Rome.

Boudicca and the Iceni tribe started a rebellion against the Romans. They gathered other tribes and destroyed Colchester, St Albans and London before being defeated at the Battle of Watling Street

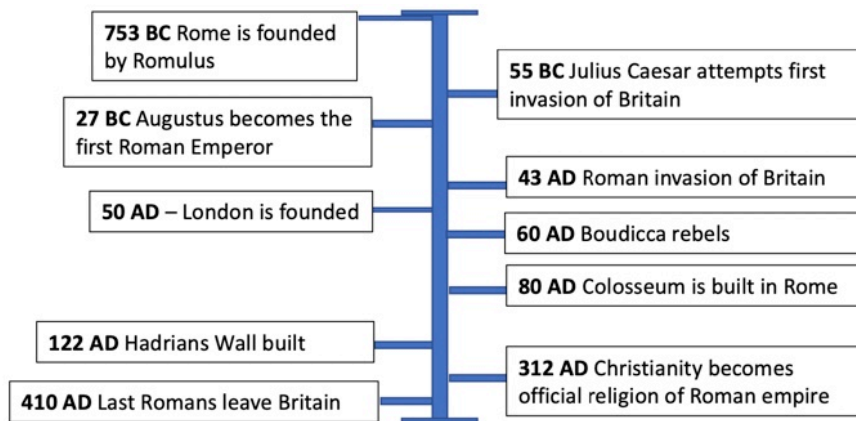
The Roman Army was so good because it was far more advanced than the Celtic tribes. Romans had better weapons, armour and well-practised battle tactics.

The Romans introduced many things to Britain, the remains of which have told us about their way of life. They include buildings, towns, roads, laws, government, vegetables and the calendar.

The last Romans left Britain in 410CE to defend Rome against attacks from barbarians. After they had gone, Britain was open to invasion by other groups.
