
KS1 History Knowledge Organiser: Explorers: Ibn Battuta


(The lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements)

Key Vocabulary & Concepts	
Explorer	A person who explores a new or unfamiliar place.
Significant	Something important and worth knowing about.
Timeline	A record of events in the order they took place.
Empire	Lots of countries ruled over by a single person.
Emperor	The ruler of an empire (similar to a Sultan, Khan or King).
Islam	The religion of Muslims.
Muslim	A follower of the religion of Islam.
Pilgrimage	A journey to a sacred place.
Hajj	The pilgrimage of Muslims to the holy city of Mecca.
Century	A period of 100 years.
Primary Source	Something that comes from the time being studied.

Ibn Battuta Timeline

1304: Born in Tangier, Morocco.

1310-25: Studied at an Islamic school. 1325–32: Makes a pilgrimage to the holy city of Mecca. Travels across North Africa and Arabia.

1332-47:

Travels to seek employment with the Sultan of Delhi. Travels across Asia to China.

1349-1354:

Explores Spain and North and West Africa.

1354-55:

Dictates details of his travels for the Rihla.

1368 or 1369: Dies in Morocco

Dies in Moroco (probably of Black Plague).
